




## Panoramic viewpoint: the valley of Poschiavo



The valley of Poschiavo is the most direct north-south link between the Engadin (and the Inn valley) and Valtellina (and the Adda valley). Situated in the southern slopes of the Alps it drops by almost 3'500 meters over a distance, as the crow flies, of only 25 km. This drop, one of the most remarkable in the alpine area, goes from the summit of Piz Palù (3'905 meters above sea level) to the point where the Poschiavino torrent feeds into the Adda river (414 meters above sea level) - ref. www.poschiavo.ch.
